What is Composition?

- How the elements of a photo are arranged
- Can be made up of multiple elements or just a few
- How an artist tells a story within the confines of a single frame

Humans and Images

- Brightest element
- Most saturated colour
- Area of highest contrast
- Human face

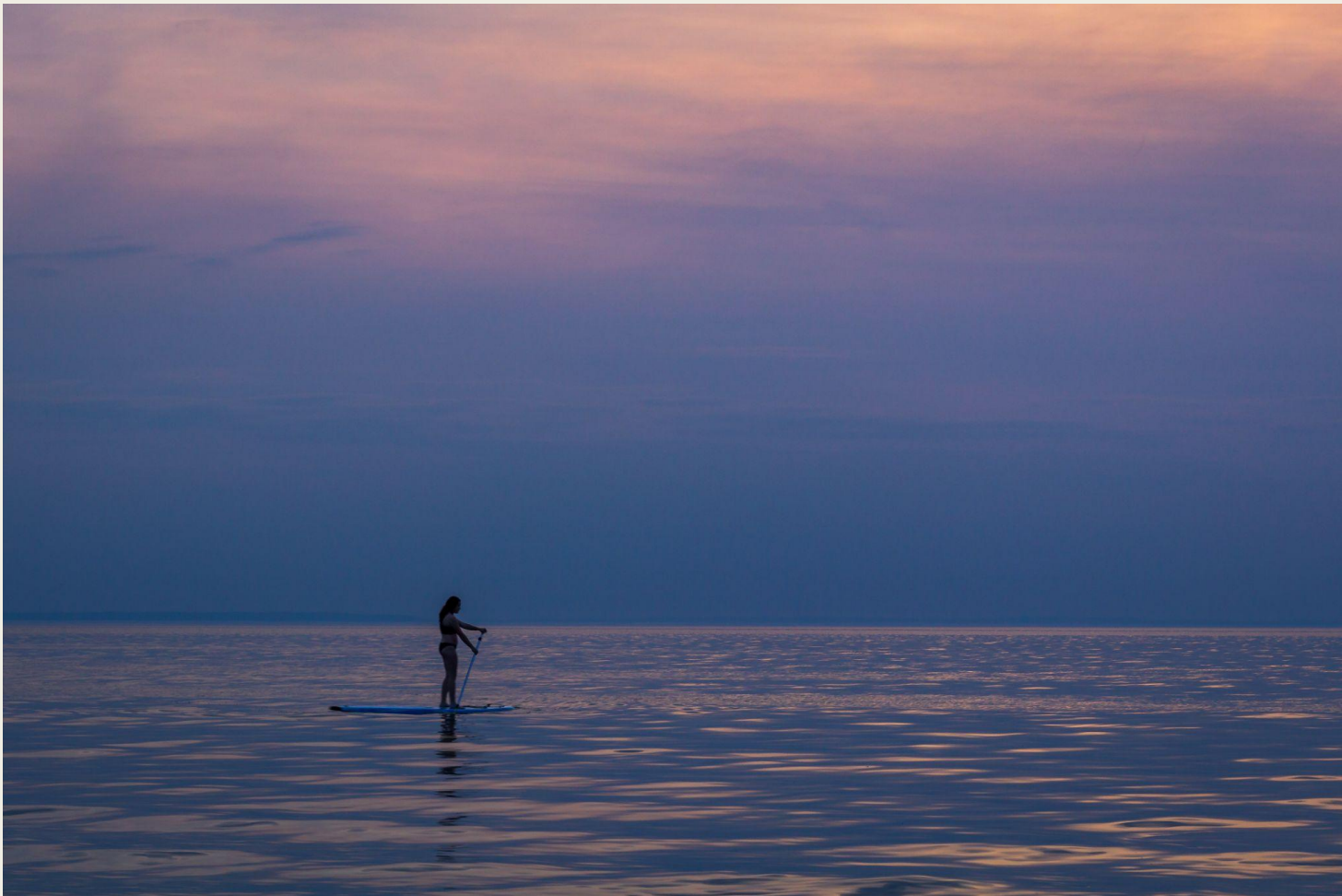
Negative Space

- The area surrounding the main subject, which is left unoccupied
- Helps draw the eye to the main subject - less distraction
- Portrays a sense of scale and adds impact to the image
- Frame your subject closer to the edge of the frame
- Use a shallow depth of field to blur the background

Perspective

- The sense of depth or spatial relationship between objects in a photo
- By changing perspective, subjects can appear much smaller or larger than normal
- Up and down
- Get high or low
- Fill the frame - get close
- Place something in the foreground
- Look for reflections

Leading Lines

- Line that directs the eye into the frame, leading to the subject
- Best if coming from the corners
- Rivers, streams, paths, walls



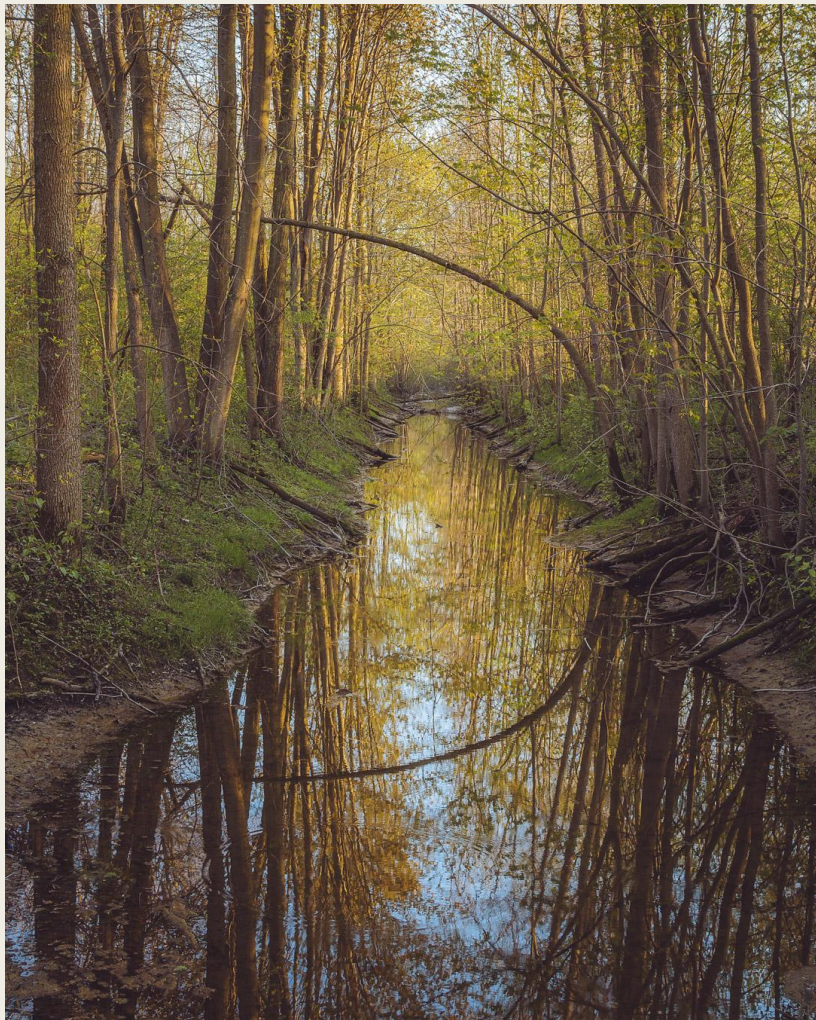

Foreground Interest

- Can create a more dynamic and interesting photo
- Can lead the viewer's eye into the shot
- Adds depth and perspective
- Get low to accentuate the foreground

Framing

- Add interest to other parts of the image
- Draws attention to the subject
- Shoot through a window, door, archway
- Adds depth, layers, context

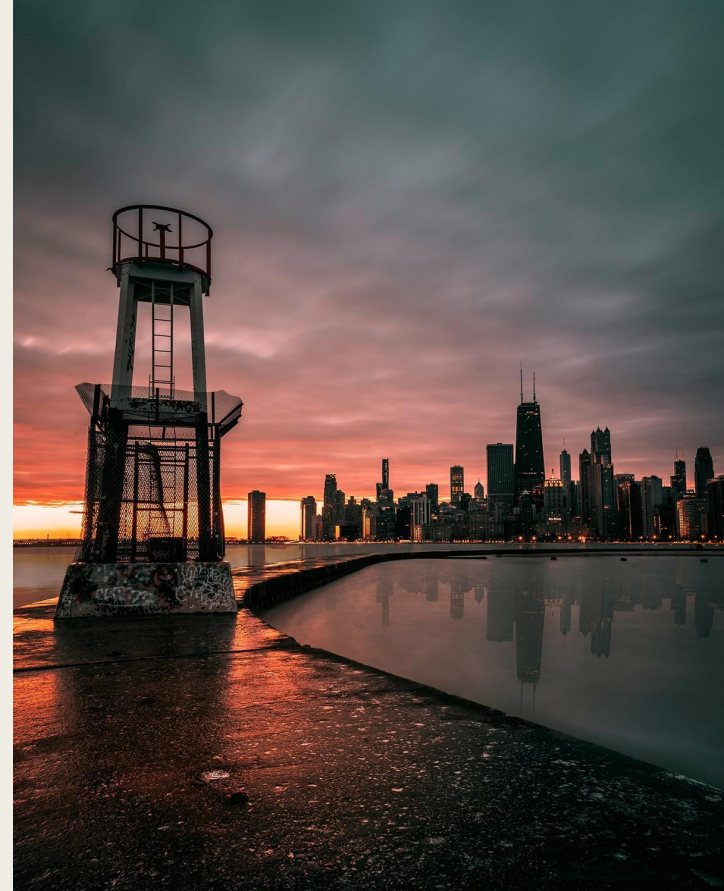

General Composition Tips

- Keep horizon straight
- Don't just settle for your first composition
- Check your edges
- Look for balance – symmetry, complementary colours, asymmetry
- Keep it simple
